QUERER

ESPAÑOL	INGLÉS
Yo quiero	I'd like or love
Tú quieres	You'd like or love
Él/ella quiere	He/she'd like or love

SER

ESPAÑOL	INGLÉS
Yo soy	I am
Tú eres	You are
Él/ella es	He/she is

ESTAR

ESPAÑOL	INGLÉS
Yo estoy	I am
Tú estás	You are
Él/ella está	He/she is

TENER

ESPAÑOL	INGLÉS
Yo tengo	I have
Tú tienes	You have
Él/ella tiene	He/she has

IR

ESPAÑOL	INGLÉS
Yo voy	I go
Tú vas	You go
Él/ella va	He/she goes



GUSTAR

ESPAÑOL	INGLÉS
Me gusta	I like
Te gusta	You like
Le gusta	He/she likes

NOTE: In Spanish it is **not** correct to say YO ME GUSTA or TÚ TE GUSTA or ÉL/ELLA LE GUSTA.

HABER

ESPAÑOL	INGLÉS
Hay	There is/are

NOTE: **HAY** has got only one form for singular and plural.

1. Our first lessons will be centred on the seven most frequent verbs in all languages in the world.
2. We'll learn them in context: in a conversation, in an interaction, in a story... learning them by hard won't help us to communicate.
3. This is called to learn a language in a natural way so that it makes sense to our mind and purpose to interact with others.
4. Once we learn them, we'll be able to speak and understand about:
 - any existence (*hay*),
 - any possession (animals, car, house...) (*tengo/tienes/tiene*),
 - who you or others are (like, jobs, nationality...) (*soy/eres/es*),
 - in what place you are (or others) (*estoy/estás/está*),
 - likes and dislikes (*me gusta/te gusta/le gusta*)
 - places you and others go (*voy/vas/va*)
 - things, animals, and people you would like or love (*quiero/quieres/quiere*)
